





1. Basis of preparation of Financial Statements: - The financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention, on accrual basis, in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

2. 5. Revenue recognition: - Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. Revenue from operations includes sale of goods, services and is recorded net of taxes.

6. Borrowing costs: - Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

7. Taxation: - Provision for tax for the year comprises current income-tax and deferred tax. Current income-tax is determined in respect of taxable income with deferred tax being determined as the tax effect of timing differences representing the difference between taxable incomes and accounting income that originate in one period, and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent period(s). Such deferred tax is quantified using rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the end of the financial year.

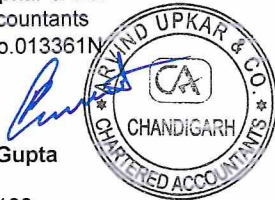
